

C. W. Oldham Funeral Rites Set Thursday

Funeral services for Charles William Oldham, 85, educator and Dallas real estate-insurance man near-

ly forty years who died at his home, 5814 Richmond, Wednesday, will be conducted at 4 p.m. Thursday at Weiland's Funeral Church, 2909 Live Oak, near Liberty, by the Rev. Francis A. Eddin, pastor of the Munger Place

Methodist Church. Burial will be in Grove Hill Cemetery.

Mr. Oldham came to Dallas in the early 1900's from Texarkana, where he had been superintendent of schools. He was a native of Weakley County, Tenn., and received his degree from Bowling Green College in Bowling Green, Ky. In 1882 he married Miss Ida Florence Lett at Bradford, Tenn.

After a number of years in educational work in Kentucky and Tennessee, Mr. Oldham became president of Carr Institute in Fulton, Ky., where he remained four years. From there he went to Texarkana and to Dallas to enter the real estate-insurance investment business. He retired several years ago.

A lifelong member of the Methodist Church, he served many years as steward of the Munger Place Methodist Church.

Surviving Mr. Oldham are his wife, two sons, Cherry J. Oldham and J. Bryan Oldham; a daughter,

Miss Mabel Ruth Oldham; a brother, T. G. Oldham Sr., all of Dallas; a sister, Mrs. Bertie E. Patterson, Birmingham, Ala., and six grandchildren of Dallas.
